What does a day as a Fischer Watch DOG look like?

Watch DOG Duties

The most important duty of a Conrad Fischer Watch DOG is to interact with the students. In the morning when you arrive, you will help to greet the students as they get off the bus. Dads are asked to arrive at 7:45am, in time to discuss the morning schedule, change into your Watch D.O.G.S T-shirt and be ready to meet the kids as they arrive at school. The official Watch D.O.G.S greeting is a high five. Next you will be introduced in the morning announcements.

You'll get an orientation and tour of the school before being introduced to your student's class where you will spend a majority of the day helping the students with class work, going out for recess or acting as a reading buddy. Make sure to bring a lunch as you will be eating in the school lunch room where you will have the opportunity to eat with your student and engage the other students at your table.
